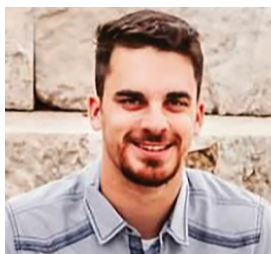

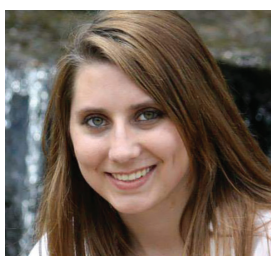
Carder Sprous
