TARTANBAND



The Maryville College Tartanband began in 2016 as a student-focused wind ensemble and was expanded in 2022 to provide the foundation for the College's new marching band. As an ensemble of students that meets

as a class and performs a broad range of music (from popular music to jazz to works for contemporary windband) onstage, the Tartanband also will take the form of a pep band for football and basketball games starting in 2022 and eventually transition to a marching band.

MC³ BAND

The MC³ Band serves a dual purpose: to provide a means of artistic expression for all its members (students, faculty, staff, & community) within the wind band medium, and to provide Maryville students with the opportunity to perform and learn within a large ensemble setting. Using a traditional symphonic band instrumentation, the band performs repertoire from the entire scope of the wind band tradition.

THE ORCHESTRA AT MARYVILLE COLLEGE

The Orchestra at Maryville College (OMC) is a full symphony orchestra

comprised of strings, winds, and percussion. A College and community ensemble, the OMC brings live symphonic performances to the public stage three times per season. Membership in the orchestra is open to all student orchestral musicians by audition.
